## **Mandatory Pumping**

Township Ordinance 2007-1 states that all residences in Letterkenny Township that are not connected to public sewer must have their septic tanks pumped once every three years. If you reside in Letterkenny Central, residences with Orrstown, Pleasant Hall, or Upper Strasburg addresses (not in the Horse Valley Area), you may be due to have your septic tank pumped this year. Please contact the township office if you are unsure when your septic tank was last pumped. Thank you for your cooperation.

## **Shippensburg Borough's Compost Facility**

Letterkenny Township residents are now able to use the Shippensburg Borough's Compost Facility to dispose of garden and yard waste. To take advantage of this service, residents must register at the Shippensburg Borough Office located at 111 N. Fayette St, Shippensburg. Once your identification and residency are confirmed, the Borough will issue a Compost Facility Pass. The fee for the 2025 Pass is \$30 and is valid from January 1 through December 31.
