
Historical Landmarks

Did you know that there are three historical landmarks in Letterkenny Township? The Horse Valley Bridge, Rocky Spring Presbyterian Church, and Skinner Tavern are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.



Skinner Tavern has also been know as Skinner's Inn, Halfway Hotel, Western Inn, and Geyer Hotel. It is located along Upper Strasburg Road between Lower Horse Valley Road and Upper Horse Valley Road. The original stone tavern was likely built by John Skinner Sr. in 1788, and it is rumored that President George Washington spent a night there when traveling from Bedford to Philadelphia in October 1794.
